### Executive summary

The report aims to present an analysis of relevant post-2020 strategies in Albania and a detailed analysis of strategic national priorities with respect to the European Commission priorities and United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG).

This report is inspired by SEE2020 Strategy, European Union's (EU) 2020 Strategy and National Strategy for Development and Integration 2015-2020 (NSDI).

The NSDI provides the framework for national strategic priorities and targets under 27 sector and cross-sector strategies. The NSDI relies on six pillars: good governance, democracy and rule of law; growth through fiscal stability and increasing competitiveness; sustainable growth through efficient use of resources; development and social cohesion through investment in individuals; EU accession; and involvement of the civil society.

The new Albania sectoral and crosscutting strategies post-2020 seek to boost prosperity, job creation, enhance competitiveness and promote investment, and to underscore the importance of the EU perspective for the Albania future, through coordinated cooperation across a number of important policy dimensions.

This report is divided into three main parts: Part I provides a summary overview of the main findings; Part II contains a detailed review including: (i) mid and long-term national strategies and priorities post-2020: (ii) review of post-2020 initiatives and projects beyond government sphere: (iii) linkages of mapped strategies and priorities with European Commission priorities (iv) mapped existing and potential national strategies and priorities with United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, and (v) mapping of all donor strategic documents and visions, national coordination mechanisms for the development of strategies and the mechanisms on strategic planning.

Finally, the report includes brief information on the coordination mechanisms for developing the economy's priorities, followed by an analytical report including a list of indicators to measure the implementation of priorities and a list of the ongoing and planned projects supporting the preparation of Albania's long-term priorities.

### I. Introduction

Albania has established a comprehensive system for policy-making and coordination. The Integrated Planning System (IPS) provides the overall architecture to ensure that government policy planning, budgeting and monitoring are linked and operate efficiently. The three cornerstones of IPS are: the national and sector strategies providing guidance to high-level policy making; the European integration process describing the planning and resource requirements to achieve the objectives under the EU integration agenda; and the medium-term budget process detailing the short and medium-term planning and financial arrangements for the delivery of policies by each ministry and government agency.

In May 2016, the Albanian Government adopted the National Strategy for Development and Integration 2015-2020 (NSDI II). The NSDI II is the main policy document that outlines the development vision and strategic priorities for Albania as a middle-income economy aiming to advance upper middle-income level by achieving the national value proposition of "a strengthening democracy, on the path towards its integration with the European Union (EU), with a competitive, stable and sustainable economy, and with guarantees of fundamental human rights and liberties".

Actually, the Government of Albania is at the preparation phase for the new strategic framework planning cycle post-2020. The actual 2015-2020 NSDI II, as well as a number of sector and cross-cutting strategies are at their final stage. Most of them will be finalised by 2020. This planning cycle coincides with the new EU IPA programming and the new historical phase for Albania – the opening of the negotiations with the European Union.

Following the European Union Delegation's request for extension of the "Country's Strategic Framework" in several areas of Good Governance Sector (including Public Finance Management, Public Administration Reform, Anti-Corruption, Decentralisation, Digitalisation in order to provide budget support from IPA 2019-2020), the institutions responsible for adopting and implementing the relevant strategies have planned to undertake several actions to revise their strategic documents by 2019-2020.

Albania is fully committed to implementing the Agenda 2030 in the context of the NSDI II and the European integration process. Significant progress has been made to align the NSDI II and all related sector strategies with the Sustainable Development Goals, supporting the economy to build its vision 2030.

### 2. Current state of play

## 2.1 MID AND LONG-TERM NATIONAL STRATEGIES AND PRIORITIES

NSDI serves as an important reference document for Albania's development partners. In addition to the NSDI, there are other sector and cross-sector strategies that contribute to the strategic goals of the Albanian Government. The main strategic documents that serve as a reference are: Economic Reform Programme(ERP), Public Administration Reform (PAR) strategy, Strategy for Public Finance Management (PFM), Digital Albania Strategy, Strategy for Decentralisation and Local Governance, National Employment and Skills Strategy (NESS), Transport Strategy, inter-sectoral Strategy against Corruption, Justice Sector Reform Strategy (JSRS), and Road Map for Drafting Policy and Measures for Enabling Environment to Civil Society.

Based on MTBP 2020-2022: To enable economic development and improve the socio-economic conditions of the population over the medium-term cycle 2020-2022, the government will continue funding the priorities set out in 2017-2021 governance programme as follows:

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### Recovery and financial consolidation of the power sector

Albania's Energy Strategy 2018–2030 is the core strategic document for the energy sector, prepared and adopted by the Albanian Government. The strategy is consistent with the national efforts to sustain economic development and meet commitments of the energy community, as well as for EU integration and other international agreements while increasing the security of the energy supply and minimising environmental impacts with affordable costs for Albanian citizens and the economy.

In December 2017, the government adopted National Energy Efficiency Action Plan 2017–2020 while the National Renewable Energy Action Plan 2018–2020 is currently being revised.

The National Energy Strategy is designed to meet the development needs of the economy and provide its citizens and consumers with a stable, reliable and affordable supply based on regional integration and diversification of the sector. Implementing this Strategy will increase the security of the energy supply and begin to integrate Albanian energy market into regional and European markets, and the South East Europe Energy Community.

The challenges facing Albania's energy sector include the following:

- O Achieving economic development in different sectors and the growing level of energy consumption per capita:
- O Improving the trend of reduction in energy intensity;
- O Strengthening institutions at national and municipal levels and improving their performance through adequate management systems in place, increased capacity and provision of financial resources to implement measures in the area of energy efficiency and renewable sources;

- O Implementing strategies, policies and the legal regulatory framework, aligned with EU directives and its Third Energy Package, as achieving the targeted objectives will lead to improvements in energy services for all citizens;
- O Enhancing security of the energy supply by improving energy efficiency, increasing the share of renewable and other indigenous energy sources, and increasing welfare through regional cooperation and integration.

In February 2018, the Albanian government adopted the Gas Master Plan, which assesses investment needs until 2040. The Gas Master Plan was adopted by the government in February 2018.

Albania has changed from being an energy exporter to becoming an importer. For this reason, the extension of generating capacity is one of the main priorities of the sector policies. The future development of energy capacity has been planned, mainly along the rivers Mat, Vjosa, Devoll and Bistrica.

Strategically, Albania addresses the new RES law, regulations and institutional reforms, currently including incentives for a share of RES in the electricity tariff reform, market development and integration with EU and regional markets. The 2030 RES Development Strategy aims to: (i) reduce energy imports and increase domestic RES electricity generation to meet 2030 demand by diversifying the RES sources, not only with hydro, but also with solar photovoltaic and wind power generation, and (ii) increase the use of RES technologies, based on least-cost planning and environmental protection principles through development of mechanisms to encourage FDI in Albania's energy sector.

However, Albania has delayed electricity market reforms and should accelerate the implementation of the connectivity reform measures, especially by removing legal and contractual obstacles to the integration of energy markets. In the coming year, Albania should in particular:

- O diversify electricity production away from hydropower and promote alternative and renewable energy sources while complying with environmental standards, and establish an organised dayahead electricity market;
- O finalise the unbundling of energy companies and abolish legal obstacles to the right of customers to change their electricity supplier;
- of fully align its Energy Efficiency Law with the acquis, set up an energy efficiency fund and draft and adopt secondary legislation implementing the Energy Performance of Buildings Directive.

### Integrated Water Management

The Albania Government has committed to a new approach to water management. The aim is to improve the overall performance of water sector, considering water as one of the key priorities, through implementing a new and integrated approach for the sector. The new approach is firmly based on EU financial mechanisms, the political programme and the process of definition and assessment of strategic priorities.

The vision of water sector sees Albania, by 2027, as an economy with efficient use of water and integrated and operational water resources management, which includes a complete monitoring system, and management of flood risk and water scarcity. Management of water resources is based on the principles of equity and sustainability for equal benefits, social, economic and gender-based, and environmental justice for current and future generations.

Based on the institutional framework for the integrated management of water resources, the **National Strategy on Integrated Water Resource Management 2018-2027** and its short-term Action Plan, aim by the year 2027to integrate all water-related issues within a single political and strategic document with relevant targets to be met.

National Water Supply and Sewerage Sector Strategy 2019-2030 sees water as the main priority.

The National Sector Programme 2018 - 2030 (NSP) for integrated water management has also been developed. This 12-year programme for water sector was prepared through the contribution of four sub-thematic groups (defined by Decision No. 4, dated 2.12.2015 of the National Water Council "On the establishment, organisation and functioning of sub-thematic groups in area of integrated water management") and harmonised by the Technical Secretariat of the National Water Council. NSP 2018-2030 sets out key pillars for water sector in the future. The aim is to integrate all water-related issues into a single political and strategic document.

The National Strategy on Integrated Water Resources Management 2018–2027, as adopted by the government in February 2018, sets the main strategic objectives, with relevant targets to be met, by the year 2027, as follows:

- O Ensure fair and sustainable use of water resources in order to meet all needs, by applying the respective legal framework prepared and adopted in compliance with the EU directives;
- O Ensure a good quality status for all water resources, by applying the respective legal framework prepared and adopted in compliance with the EU directives;

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- O Address the risks generated by water scarcity (droughts) and floods through management and investments in order to meet all the needs, by applying the respective legal framework prepared and adopted in compliance with the EU directives;
- O Ensure models and data on water and climate are widely accepted and reliable for all stakeholders, and offer advice on preparation of appropriate policy based on these models and data from the relevant institutions;
- O All-inclusive sustainable water management in order to meet all needs, offering equal socioeconomic benefits and including the next generation in the decision-making process, according to the principles of Integrated Water Resources Management and the EU directives.

The next steps in the implementation process include the following:

- O Strengthening the legal framework in compliance with the EU legislation;
- Final adoption of the strategic and policy documents under preparation;
- Strengthening the sub-thematic groups and their role in implementation of national water sector programme;
- O Strengthening the administration offices for river basins;
- O Strengthening the monitoring system and full implementation of GIS water information system;
- O Adoption of the prepared river basin management plans as a guideline for planning and management at the river basin level;
- O Fully establish the Agency for Water Resources Management.

One key achievement in 2016 was the presentation of the Strategic Plan for Marine and Coastal Protected Areas, incorporated into the Strategic Document for Biodiversity Protection approved by government by a decision of Council of Ministers and presented at a meeting of parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity.

As part of the strategic planning for the region, the government has contributed to the preparation of the South East Europe 2020 Strategy, including the preparation and adoption of a National Action Plan. In particular, Pillar 3 (environment) focuses on the water–energy–food nexus, water infrastructure and integrated water resources management. The strategy sets the policy objectives and measures for improving the sector performance as follows:

- O Expand and improve the quality of water supply and sewerage services;
- O Focus water utilities towards the principles of cost control and full costs recovery;
- O Improve governance and regulation of the sector;
- O Invest to increase capacity of sector workforce;
- O Progress towards convergence of Albanian law with EU water directives.

Legislative alignment with the acquis on waste management has advanced, except for the issues of ship recycling, mining and electronic waste. In September 2016, an amendment to the 2011 Law on Integrated Management of Waste was adopted, aimed at further alignment with the acquis as it allows for the import of waste, albeit only for recycling purposes.

The National Integrated Water Management Sector Programme 2018–2030 sets the key pillars for the sector. The aim is to integrate all water-related issues within a single political and strategic document.

Based on this, the vision for the future of water sector by 2030 is "Governance of the water sector in line with EU best practices and standards". The vision of water sector is the following: Albania shall have efficient use of water and integrated and operational water resources management, which includes a complete monitoring system, and management of flood risk and water scarcity. Management of water resources is based on the principles of equity and sustainability for equal benefits, social, economic and gender-based, and environmental justice for current and future generations.

The National Sectoral Programme defines three main strategic goals:

- O Encouraging sustainable use of water resources, equitable distribution of users while maximising economic benefits and respecting environmental conditions and principles of sustainable development;
- Protecting aquatic ecosystems, including surface and ground water, from misuse and overuse, with better coordination of all regulatory activities and also taking into account the principles of sustainable development;
- O Protecting the population and property from harmful effects caused by water, including floods, rainstorms and erosion, in an affective and sustainable manner.

Many challenges exist, the key among which are:

- O Improving the water supply and sanitation services;
- O Constructing water and waste water infrastructure and wastewater treatment plants, and the sustainable maintenance and operation of existing ones;
- O Strengthening the institutions, as well as management and operational capacities;
- O Rehabilitation and modernisation of the existing infrastructure related to irrigation, drainage and flood protection;
- O Identification, assessment and monitoring of disaster risks and enhancing early warning systems;
- O Strengthening of disaster preparedness for effective response at all levels;
- O Preparation and implementation of river basin management plans;
- O Monitoring of water users, by river basin;
- Rehabilitation of damaged river beds;
- O Improvement and expansion of coverage of water supply and sewerage services, including for the poorer peripheral urban areas and rural populations;
- O Enhancing skills and competences of human resources for applying acquired knowledge and expertise in the water and sanitation sector, as well as in preventing and coping with natural catastrophes;
- O Increase in financial resources to meet EU standards on water and environment;
- Implementation of strategies, policies and legal regulatory framework, aligned with EU acquis, for achieving targeted objectives, to lead to improvement of services for all citizens.

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### Improving innovation and enhancing competitiveness

The Government of Albania aims to encourage private sector investment to help meet its development goals, in particular by accelerating private sector growth and creating new jobs. This vision is outlined in some national strategies, namely:

National Strategy on Diaspora 2018–2024 emphasises the relevance of Diaspora's investments in Albania, including specific measures to attract such investments and the role of non-monetary remittances, such as the transfer of know-how and technologies. This strategic goal is related to the economic and social development and the image of Albania. The Albanian Diaspora Development Fund (ADDF) aims to provide and distribute financial means for concrete prioritised projects having impact on improving the living conditions. Publishing Centre of Diaspora (PCD) is responsible for publishing and distributing the approved educational textbooks and relevant literature that will serve to teach and preserve the national identity in the Albanian Diaspora communities. The State Committee for Diaspora (SCD) is a consultative body of the Council of Ministers for the coordination of policies and state activities regarding Diaspora.

In June 2019, Albania adopted the national strategy on migration governance and its action plan covering 2019-22, providing a clear framework to better manage and coordinate migration flows.

Over recent years government efforts have been focused particularly on new employment generation activities. **The National Employment and Skills Strategy (NESS) 2014–2020** puts knowledge and skills at the heart of the economic model and is expected to trigger inclusive long-term growth. The goal of NESS is to promote jobs and skills opportunities for all Albanian women and men. This strategy represents one of the strongest commitments of the Albanian government to the welfare of its citizens. In

2015, the EU committed itself to NESS by selecting it to receive budget support through a Sector Reform Contract. A mid-term review of the National Employment and Skills Strategy (NESS) was completed. The revised action plan of the strategy will cover the period between 2019 and 2022 and is adopted during the first semester of 2019.

The newly approved legislative framework on Employment and Vocational Education and Training (VET) in Albania aims to increase opportunities for labour force and strengthen labour market functioning, by setting clear objectives of the public employment services, active and passive programmes, and VET, in a coordinated and demand-driven manner, responding to the national priorities set in the National Employment and Skills Strategy (NESS) 2019-2022.

The law foresees that the National Employment Service (NES) is transformed and reorganised into the National Agency for Employment and Skills (NAES), responsible for policy implementation in the areas of employment and skills development.

The Ministry of Finance and Economy (MFE) has finalised the relevant secondary legislation on establishing the NAES, defining its organisation and functioning, which was approved by the Council of Ministers Decision, no. 554, on 31st of July 2019. The proposed structure has been sent to the Department of Public Administration and is expected to be formalised during September 2019 through an order of the Prime Minister.

The aim of **National strategy for scientific research, technology and innovation for 2017-2023**, currently under implementation is: (i) to increase investments for Scientific Research, Technology and Innovation up to 1% of GDP by 2022, (increase investment in research, in line with its own commitments and European Research Area priorities);(ii) adopt smart specialisation strategy;(iii) ensure higher participation in Horizon 2020.

In January 2017, the government approved the 2017-2021 action plan to support the development of innovative policies, based on Triple Helix approach, recommendation of Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) programme for South East Europe, Council of Ministers Decision No 580 dated 03.08.2016 on the establishment of Programmed for Economy Support and defining the beneficiaries and rules for its implementation (Official Journal 153, Viti 2016,p. 11818), and Council of Ministers Decision No 580 dated 03.08.2016 on the approval of the Investment Policy Guideline of Albania Government (Official Journal 153,Viti 2016,p.11816).

This action plan aims to promote better links between academia, industry and government, however no progress was made on its implementation in 2018. A new draft of the law on scientific research in the Republic of Albania has been finalised. It is scheduled to be presented in the Parliament in 2019 together with the new draft law on the Academy of Science.

**Tourism Development Strategy 2019-2023 and Action Plan**: The National Tourism Development Strategy is multi-dimensional and encompasses a range of sectors, sub-sectors and policies, focusing on international promotion of Albania as a worthy destination, competing qually in the global tourism market. Consequently, Albania's positioning in international market will be based on:

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(i) Long-term sustainability of public interventions and investments, to turn the economy's tourism economy into a tourist attraction, a better place to live and a more profitable potential for tourism ventures. (ii) Regular protection and development of geo-spaces in respect of nature, ecosystems, demographic and urban development in all areas with a potential in tourism development. (iii) Creation of new development industries and clusters as well as consolidation of the tourism offer and creation of new products.(iv) Increasing the added value and impact of the sector on the economy and employment. (v) Development of new products and services in tourism, as well as improvement of their quality. (vi) Improving economy's image and promoting authentic local products.

All strategies, laws, regulations and decrees issued under the earlier investment-related legislation, including the Strategic Investment Law, will be streamlined and reformed to ensure adherence with good practice principles. The Albania Government reform is targeted at creating a comprehensive investment legal framework for domestic and foreign investors compatible with international good practices, and at developing a mechanism to systematically address investor grievances and increase investment retention. The proposed reform is part of the priorities of the government's programme, the Economic Reform Programme (ERP) 2019–2021<sup>2</sup> under boosting the trade reform measure (Pillar I), Integrated Growth of SEE 2020, and Business Improvement District Strategy 2014–2020, and contributes to an increase in competitiveness.

**The Economic Reform Programme (ERP) 2019 – 2021** outlines the main macroeconomic and fiscal policies aiming to establish a clear balance between the internal strengths and external threats, with a view to enable sustainable growth, increased employment and reduced public debt.

The goals of the Integrated Land Management Reform in Albania are the following:

These reform measures encapsulate some of the priorities of the incumbent government ranging from energy market liberalisation, diversification of energy sources, transport, broadband connectivity, land consolidation and defragmentation, businesses environment, trade, VET, water and wastewater sector, to employment and social inclusion. The investment climate reform is aimed at the promotion of domestic and foreign investments based on the following goals:

O (i) steady economic growth of the economy; (ii) business-friendly environment; (iii) free flow of goods, services and capital; (iv) boosted investments; (vi)increased potential of the region's industry; (vii) more jobs created; (viii) increased funding and a more focused Research Development and Innovations Strategy in a number of specific sectors, particularly in energy, agro-food and sustainable tourism, which would support the efforts of government to attract investment.

### Land Management Reform

The integrated land management reform initiated by the Albanian government in 2013 is supported by the World Bank and aims to take important steps to improve service delivery for citizens, increasing transparency and minimising opportunities for corrupt practices in the sector. The government's e-Gateway has been put in operation, where various systems are connected and share information, as well as the National Spatial Data Information Geo-portal.

The main reform interventions consist of implementation of the following policy goals: (i) creation of a cohesive framework of land policies to consistently guide land activities, including an overall National Land Policy and the creation of sub-sector land policies, e.g. for forestry, tourism, real estate and agriculture; (ii) institutional reform to reduce existing institutional fragmentation and overlaps and create more efficient land institutions; (iii) provision of a supportive, harmonised legal and regulatory framework; and (iv) implementation of a capacity development strategy across the land sector.

The main goal of the **Albanian National Land Consolidation Strategy**, adopted by the government in 2016to be implemented until the year 2028, is the creation of family farms that are economically viable, competitive and sustainable. This is to be done in a way that contributes to the sustainable, inclusive and gender and socially equitable development of the rural and agricultural sector, economic growth, enhanced food security and reduction of poverty, rational use of natural resources, environmental protection and restoration of natural areas.

The strategy aims to assist farmers to improve farm structures by providing opportunities to reduce land fragmentation and enlarge farm size by developing conditions for land consolidation, including a national land consolidation programme, adoption of an appropriate legal framework, and successful implementation of land consolidation projects. This strategy targets all farmers, with its primary target group being farming families (all members: male, female, young and old) who have the potential to drive agricultural production. Other types of farmers are also eligible to participate in land consolidation projects, with their participation being important in order to achieve sustainable impacts.

The Government adopted an action plan and, in 2015, introduced a mechanism to effectively resolve the property issues, through compensation or restitution of properties to form owners over a period of ten years.

- O Improve the system of property rights, titles, registration and restitution (issuing of titles and completion of registration);
- O Establish an Integrated Multipurpose Cadastre based on a unique, tax-value property map;
- O Empower the land market through capitalisation and circulation, land consolidation for tourism and agriculture, land easement instruments, land access tools, land professionals and land services.

**National Waste Management Strategy 2010-2025**: The Albanian Government has adopted waste management legislation in line with the EU requirements. Waste management policies consist of a legislative framework and the National Integrated Solid Waste Strategy with the respective plan.

The National Strategy and Plan guide policy making at the national, regional and local level. The National Strategy establishes general objectives and stipulates guiding principles and decision-making criteria, which provide the basis for the preparation for implementation of strategies and plans. The strategy and plan are based on the need to protect public health, environment and economy through the reduction of waste, recovery of resources and maximisation of recycling and re-use. The Strategy and Plan lead the way towards a circular economy and are aligned with the EU Waste Framework Directive (WFD). Both place emphasis on feasibility and affordability in order to provide a useful policy and planning instrument.

**Strategic Biodiversity Policy Paper**: Albania has been and continues to be a participant in European and regional initiatives related to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD), especially in the PAN-European Strategy on Biological and Landscape Diversity (PESBLD). The main objectives for implementing the CBD and PESBLD are: I) protection and improvement of biological and landscape diversity; 2) incorporation of the principles and policies required for sustainable biodiversity use and management; and 3) promoting sustainable development for present and future generations.

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### Fiscal Structural Reform

The financial structural reform was focused on improvements in the government's revenue collection. As an essential component of fiscal policy, the structural reform is an efficient instrument for enhancing innovation and competitiveness, through facilitation of business and economic development and macroeconomic growth and fiscal stability. As established in the Strategy for the Management of Public Finances<sup>3</sup> for 2014–2020, measures to improve revenue collection in Albania include the following:

- O Review of tax policy and reform of tax and customs administrations, with a view to enhancing revenue collection efficiency, reducing the tax gap, and fighting tax evasion and informal economy;
- O Adapting the tax policy to the new legislation on both corporate and personal income tax;
- O Reform of property tax;
- O Continuous review of tax percentages in light of budget needs and in line with economic developments;
- O Measures against fiscal informality and payments systems.

Approved by government in December 2014

The mid-term Economic Reform Programme 2019–2021 outlines the main macro-economic and fiscal policies aiming to establish a clear balance between internal strengths of and external threats to the system, with a view to enabling sustainable growth, increased employment and reduced public debt. In addition, ERP introduces the priority structural medium-term reforms aimed at increasing domestic production, stimulating new investments and ensuring sustainable growth and increased competitiveness. Governments priorities are oriented towards fiscal consolidation and improved public expenditure management, reduction of infrastructure deficits, regulatory and institutional reform and improvement of social protection systems.

**PFM strategy is ongoing** (started in May 2018), including identification of new priorities to be addressed, which include, among others, Public Investment Management (**PIM**) including fragmented approval, appraisal, selection, and monitoring processes for public investment projects, Public Private Partnerships (**PPPs**) and concessions; analysis of, monitoring, reporting and mitigating fiscal risks; reaccumulation of arrears<sup>4</sup>at local and central government levels following the clearance of all pre-2014 arrears; improving the follow-up of internal and external audit recommendations; strengthening of internal control standards across government in line with a comprehensive PIFC policy; online access to the Treasury for all budget institutions.

PFM priorities are currently being reassessed based on a mid-term review of the strategy in 2018<sup>5</sup>. The goal of this reassessment is to: improve budget planning and management; strengthen internal control implementation across government; prevent arrears at central and local government level; follow up on internal and external audit recommendations; improve investment planning and management; improve public procurement review and compliance with procurement rules; grant more institutions online access to the Treasury; and analyse the fiscal risks of state-owned enterprises.

National Plan for European Integration (NPEI) 2019-2021 includes medium and long term measures, extending to 2020, in order for Albania to reach full legal approximation of the national legislation with the EU acquis and align all its sectors with standards set by the acquis chapters.

The NPEI will be revised annually to take stock of the progress achieved, not only in the approximation rate, but also in the implementation of the approximated legislation. NPEI aims to coordinate approximation process by defining priorities for acts to be approximated, ministries tasked with drafting/revising Albanian legal acts, level of approximation, and dates of adoption and entry into force.

The rate of NPEI implementation remains low, at less than 30%, and the overall quality of policy planning remains weak. The government should step up efforts to establish functional inter-institutional coordination structures for more effective implementation of the NPEI at both political and administrative level.<sup>6</sup>

### Justice system reform

The cross-sectoral justice strategy for 2017-2021 and its action plan were adopted in 2016. Parts of the earlier action plan have already been implemented. The estimated budget for its implementation is EUR 98 million, of which 35% is provided by international donors. The establishment of appropriate monitoring, evaluation and reporting mechanisms is still pending.

The Cross-Cutting Justice Strategy 2017–2021 has eight high-level strategic goals, as follows:

Goal I: Strengthening the independence, efficiency and accountability of the justice system institutions;

Goal 2 Consolidation of legal education and training, as well as specialisation of magistrates and court personnel;

Goal 3: Improvement of the operation of the judicial system by strengthening its efficiency, transparency and accessibility in accordance with European standards; Goal 4: Increasing the efficiency of the criminal justice system and anti-corruption measures through consolidation of the mission, status and functions of criminal justice institutions;

Goal 5: Improving the functioning of the justice system by providing modern electronic systems procedures and facilities for development of strong international cooperation;

Goal 6: Enhancement of the protection of human rights in the penitentiary system;

Goal 7: Improving the functioning of the Ministry of Justice and its subordinate institutions;

Goal 8: Improving the service quality of legal professions and establishing a legal framework for arbitration.

Justice reform is on ongoing process and the Analytical Paper was followed by a Justice Reform Strategy, envisaging amendments to the Albanian Constitution, development of some 40 laws, and the setting-up of several institutions. The EC 2018 Report on Albania states that "The implementation of comprehensive and thorough justice reform has continued, resulting in good progress overall. The re-evaluation of all judges and prosecutors (vetting process) has started and is delivering first tangible results."<sup>7</sup>

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The implementation of the Inter-sectoral Strategy against Corruption is overall on track, although weaknesses remain. These weaknesses include the need to strengthen ownership and institutional capacities, ensure proper costing of Strategy measures and ensure harmonisation with the ongoing actions in the anti-corruption sector (including donor activities).

National Strategy for Combating Violent Extremism and Action Plan<sup>8</sup>: In November 2015, Albania published a national strategy to counter violent extremism. As part of this programme, the government identified and focused on four areas: education, engagement with religious leaders, economic opportunity, and research. In these respective areas, the government has sought to:

- O Through its Ministry of Education help facilitate greater awareness of the threat and dangers associated with violent extremist ideology (Educate);
- O Work with religious leaders in the KMSH to support counter-narratives in the economy's official religious centres (Engagement);
- O Through its Ministry of Social Welfare and Youth devise ways to improve social and economic conditions for at-risk individuals, particularly Albanian youths (Economic Opportunity); and
- Open a centre (the first of its kind) to better study, understand, and ultimately counter the phenomenon of foreign terrorist fighting (Research).

In February 2019Albania adopted a new National Strategy on Small Arms and Light Weapons for the period from 2019 to 2024 and a corresponding action plan 2019-2021. Albania signed the regional 'Roadmap for a sustainable solution to the illegal possession, misuse and trafficking of small arms and light weapons and their ammunition in the Western Balkans by 2024' at the London summit in July 2018.

The Strategy and Action Plan ensure and monitor the fulfilment of Albania's obligations under different international conventions and documents in the area of firearms control (including the UN Programme of Action, the OSCE Document on SALW, the Arms Trade Treaty, the United Nations Protocol against the Illicit Manufacturing of and Trafficking in SALW, the EU Code of Conduct, etc.), and also the alignment with the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

In particular, the Strategy and the Action Plan refer to the "Roadmap for a sustainable solution to the illegal possession, misuse and trafficking of Small Arms and Light Weapons (SALW) and their ammunition in the Western Balkans, by 2024".

The goals of the Strategy and Action Plan correspond to those of the regional Roadmap and also with the performance indicators. Although Albania has approved the Law 74/2014 on Weapons, for the first time ever granting ownership of weapons to natural persons, it requires amendments, not only due to the experience gained during its implementation, but also because of its harmonisation with the European Firearms Directive which was amended in 2017.

Goal I: By 2023, ensure that arms control legislation is in place, fully harmonised with the EU regulatory framework and other related international obligations, and standardised across the region.

Goal 2: By 2024, ensure that arms control policies and practices in Albania are evidence based and intelligence led.

Goal 3: By 2024, significantly reduce illicit flows of firearms, ammunition and explosives (FAE) into, within and beyond Albania.

Goal 4: By 2024, significantly reduce the supply, demand and misuse of firearms through increased awareness, education, outreach and advocacy.

Goal 5: By 2024, substantially decrease the estimated number of firearms in illicit possession in Albania.

### Key findings

To enable economic development and improve the socio-economic conditions of the population over the medium-term cycle 2020 - 2022, the government will continue funding the priorities set out in its 2017-2021 governance programme as follows:

#### The six Government priorities for reforms in Albania are:

- O Innovative and citizen-centred public services;
- O Recovery and financial consolidation of the energy sector;
- O Fostering innovation and competitiveness, foreign direct investments and domestic investments;
- Integrated water management;
- O Integrated land management;
- O Financial structural reform.

Based on MTBP 2020-2022: To enable economic development and improve the socio-economic conditions of the population over the medium-term cycle 2020-2022, the government will continue funding the priorities set out in 2017-2021 governance programme as follows:

**Water Infrastructure:** Extending the water supply service, which will reach 75% nationally; extension of sewage networks to remove urban wastewater, which will reach 48% nationally; coverage of agricultural land with irrigation and drainage infrastructure, which will increase by 45,000 ha for irrigation and 70,000 ha for drainage; meeting the needs of water industry, with the aim of guaranteeing water in the required quantity and quality. For the period 2020-2022, funding for this priority will be increased from ALL 15.4 billion in 2020 to ALL 17.0 billion in 2022.

**Modernisation of public services** aimed at reforming the way of organisation and structure of relevant institutions, introduction of technology and computerisation of service, recruitment of staff andmaking service delivery to citizens quality, professional and fast. For the period from 2020 to 2022, funding for this priority is estimated at ALL 1.7 billion.

**Integrated land management** aimed at: providing justice for property titles including their registration and restitution and compensation; unification of property registries in a transparent and digital multifunctional cadastre, including all property mapping; equipping the entire surface of agricultural land with certificates of ownership; improving agricultural structures by alleviating the problem of fallow soil (8% of agricultural land) by implementing fiscal incentives. Fulfilling the objectives of this reform will benefit from the support of development partners as well as the state budget which will finance this priority with an average of ALL 5.5 billion annually for the period from 2020 to 2022.

**Employment** aimed at increasing employment and halving the gap between youth and general unemployment by supporting start-up programmes, education, vocational training and preferential market paths for youth employment.

**Public Investment** aimed at maintaining a 5% to GDP ratio will be channelled into key sectors for economic and social development such as:

**National road infrastructure**:concentration of budgetary funding for completing important national axes: Thumana - Vora - Kashar, Kashar - Rrogozhina, Milot - Balldren, Orikum - Dukat and Kardhiq - Delvina; as well as bypasses of Fier and Vlora.

**Water and sanitation**: Increasing the population's access to quality water and sanitation services through the financing of sewerage projects in the period from 2020 to 2022, with ALL 33 billion.

**Education:** Pre-university education will prioritise and finance projects for construction, reconstruction/ rebuilding or additions to the existing school. Higher education continues to support modernisation of student accommodation infrastructures as well as investments in improving the quality of the teaching process.

**Agriculture:** Productivity growth on large farms will continue to be supported with ALL 9 billion provided by the IPARD programme. These funds will improve the production, processing and marketing of agricultural products to increase their food quantity and security. The government will continue investing with the aim of "water in every parcel" and improving drainage through deepening decentralisation and increasing investment in the sector.

**Rural Infrastructure:** Improve infrastructure; assess traditions and cultural heritage; increase the level of public services; improve the aesthetic of residential housing enabling certain rural areas to have a positive economic, diversified and sustainable development, while also creating conditions for tourism and agro-tourism development.

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# 2.2. REVIEW OF POST-2020 INITIATIVES AND PROJECTS BEYOND GOVERNMENT SPHERE<sup>9</sup>

Albania has more than 600 ongoing and planned post-2020 projects<sup>10</sup>, with committed funds of EUR 4,171,868,460.

The EU provided financial assistance to Albania under the Instrument for Pre-accession Assistance (IPA I) in 2007-2013 with a total allocation of EUR 594 million. The assistance has been predominantly implemented under direct management of the EU Delegation in Tirana. The indirect management modality has been introduced with a pilot approach for IPA 2012 and 2013 national programmes.

Under IPA II (2014-2020), and in line with the priorities set out in the indicative strategy paper, Albania will benefit a total indicative allocation of EUR 649.4 million from pre-accession assistance. The Framework Agreement for IPA II entered into force in April 2015. The 2014-2017 action programmes for Albania provide EUR 170 million to promote reforms in key sectors, such as democracy and governance and rule of law and fundamental rights, and EUR 113 million to invest in competitiveness and growth. EUR 64 million for rule of law and justice reform, and EUR 30 million for environmental protection and economic development have been earmarked for 2018 action programme for Albania.

Albania benefits from support under IPA multi-country programme and participates in five cross-border cooperation programmes, as well as in transnational cooperation programmes under the European Regional Development Fund and the IPA Adriatic cross-border programme.

With IPA support Albania participates in the following EU programmes: Erasmus+, Creative Europe (Culture and Media strands), Employment and Social Innovation, Horizon 2020, Customs 2020, Fiscals 2020, Competitiveness of Enterprises and Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises Programme (COSME) and Europe for Citizens. Good Governance sector is mainly financed by **grants covering 68% of the sector financing** (or Euro 155 million).

Albania is in the process of IPA III programming and in the process of writing a **strategic document** for the five Windows (**content & indicative allocation**) for the whole period; five Windows are:

- O Rule of law, fundamental rights and democracy
- O Good governance, acquis alignment, strategic communication and good neighbourly relations
- O Green agenda and sustainable connectivity
- Competitiveness and inclusive growth
- Territorial and cross border cooperation


The five Windows, which broadly correspond to the specific objectives of the regulation, are all facets of the EU policy for enlargement and are linked with one another in a complementary manner. Also, a number of cross-cutting themes, such as climate change, civil society, gender, rights based approach, can be implemented under the five windows.

Among other outcomes, the dam instrumentation and monitoring systems are now in operation; the Komani Dam's toe rehabilitation and dredging works for the tailrace channel have been completed; rockfall protection has been fully implemented in all three power plants; electromechanical rehabilitation works on the Komani Hydropower Plant (HPP), the largest HPP in Albania, have been completed; and the refurbishment and rehabilitation of all four units have increased the power plant's benefit from the cascade operation during good hydrology seasons as well as its efficiency, hence water leakages have been eliminated and the estimated 11 GWh lost each year have been reduced to zero.

Ongoing work is focused on the Fierza and Komani Spillway Gates and stoplog rehabilitation, which will increase the benefits stemming from the optimisation of the Drini cascade and fully eliminate water leakages that are currently costing a loss of 20 GWh every year. The rehabilitation work is expected to be completed by December 2020.

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Graph I: Grant vs. Loan


The public sector has received diversified and balanced type of financing through:

- O Budget support to three subsectors (PFM, PAR and Anticorruption), in the amount of EUR 84 million provided by IPA II instrument. It also includes technical assistance (Euro 6 million).
- O Loans from the World Bank through DLI (Disbursement Linked Indicators) in the amount of Euro 74.3 million.
- O Traditional financing through grants (71 million in grants to support 30 projects).

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


Graph 2: Type of financing



### **Key findings**

Funding allocation 2014-2020: €639.5 million, priority sectors for funding in this period are: 12

Democracy & governance: Strengthening democratic institutions; reforming the civil service and public service delivery; better economic governance; improving public financial management; empowering civil society (e.g. non-state, voluntary organisations).

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Rule of law & fundamental rights: Independent, efficient judiciary; helping police fight organised crime; tackling corruption; respecting human rights conventions.

**Environment & climate action**: Alignment with EU law and standards; better treatment of waste and water; controlling air pollution.

Transport: Better infrastructure and regional connectivity; improved road safety; increased interoperability (cross-border technical compatibility).

**Competitiveness & innovation**: Supporting business competitiveness; greater market integration; improving the business environment; developing tourism.

 New measures to enforce the implementation of legal and operational framework are included in the new PFM Strategy 2019 -2022.

Technical assistance experts are developing activities aimed at strengthening the capacities of the Government, and especially the Ministry of Finance and Economy as well as other stakeholders to implement the public finance reform strategy. The components for which activities are being developed are:

- O Component I Sector Budget Support from the European Union
- O Component 2 Managing the PFM Reform
- O Component 3 Annual and Medium Term Budget Planning
- O Component 4 Transparency and Budget Inclusion
- O Component 5 Public Internal Financial Control
- O Component 6 Public Communication and Awareness

The IPA 2013 twining project for Upgrading the Albanian Customs Administration (1.8 Euro million) is close to completion (June 2019). However, another **TA assistance is planned to support Albanian customs administration** in the amount of Euro 2.4 million (subject to EUD tender procedures).

Another important project: Support for Public Accounting Reforms, financed by Swiss, is providing technical assistance and capacity building aiming to (i) improve the management of budget resources, (ii) improve decision-making, and (iii) enhance the overall transparency of the use of fiscal resources.

O <u>Department of Public Department is in the process of extending the Action Plan of the Cross-Cutting Strategy for Public Administration Reform until 2022.</u>

### **Public Services Subsector**

This subsector is receiving most funds (Euro 88.6 million or 39% of the GG&PA sector). It is supported by 4active projects, with the biggest ones being the Social Services Delivery Project and the Citizen Centric Service Delivery Project financed by means of loans from the World Bank (respectively Euro 45 and 29.3 million).

The Social Services Delivery Project is the biggest one in the sector, covering an important reform in Albania, dealing with economic assistance. The project has been extended until June 2021.

The main objective of the Citizen Centric Service Delivery Project is to simplify procedures and improve the quality and efficiency of public service delivery by reforming citizen-centred services. It consists of three components: I) strengthening of support systems, 2) increasing citizens interaction with service delivery, and 3) building capacity for service delivery.

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The project has achieved some visible results in improving public service delivery, as confirmed by mid-term project results, a survey conducted in the last quarter of 2018. The overall project progress is estimated to be satisfactory with a disbursement rate of 70 % of total funds.

The mid-term evaluation of the project related to the achievement of the Project's main objectives (PDOs) confirmed that access of citizens to public services and citizens' satisfaction with public services have improved significantly. Access to project-focused services has improved by 22 percentage points compared to baseline findings (conducted in 2016). Significant growth is also noted for subgroups, such as women and poorer groups by 18 percentage points, and the Roma population by 17 percentage points. EU and other donors are also providing support to improve citizen-centric public service delivery:

- O The EU support of Euro 1.2 million financed by IPA CAP 2014 is guided by the initiative "Innovation against corruption: Building a Model for Providing Public Citizen Services" undertaken by the Government of Albania in 2014. The reform pillars in providing citizen-centred services are: separation of reception counters from support offices; providing integrated service through reengineering of business processes; legal reform; and digitalisation of services. The project is set to finish in May 2019.
- O Austria, Italy and UN are co-financing another project in this area, amounting to Euro 2 million.

# 2.3. LINKAGES OF MAPPED STRATEGIES AND PRIORITIES WITH EUROPEAN COMMISSION PRIORITIES

The EU integration process in Albania is governed by two fundamental documents: the Roadmap for addressing the five key priorities and the National Plan for European Integration (NPEI) 2015-2020. The Roadmap provides short term measures designed to meet the five key priorities presented in the EC Enlargement Strategy of 2013. The NPEI extends to medium and long term measures in order for Albania to reach full legal approximation of the national legislation with the EU acquis and to align all its sectors with standards set by the acquis chapters. Furthermore, NPEI is in line with the budget for the upcoming year and the Mid Term Budget Programme (MTBP).

The EU integration is the overarching goal of Albania. Progress made in the fulfilment of obligations in line with the political criteria, especially constructive cooperation and political dialogue between the ruling majority and the opposition on major reforms related to the priorities of the accession process, the parliamentary elections, and measures against corruption and organised crime, conditioned the granting of candidate status to Albania by the European Union. Mapping the SDG priorities according to the EU integration process priorities is very important to align and synergise the efforts for the implementation of these processes. However, as the EU integration priorities are part of the NSDI II 2015-2020 priorities, this assessment is included in the next section.

The second National Strategy for Development and Integration (NSDI II) presents Albania's vision for its national social, democratic and economic development over the period 2016–2020 and its aspirations for European integration through six strategic priorities:

- O EU membership, with objectives related to public administration reform, a modern, professional and depoliticised civil service, more independent and accountable judicial institutions, addressing corruption, and protecting human rights;
- O Consolidating good governance, democracy and the rule of law with strong, effective and democratic government institutions and a fully functional and open judicial system with equal access for all:
- O Ensuring growth through macro-economic and fiscal stability;
- O Ensuring growth through increased competitiveness and innovation;
- O Investing in people and social cohesion with objectives related to a modern educational system, a universal and quality health-care system, expanded employment opportunities, a stronger social protection system, gender equality and social inclusion;
- O Ensuring growth through connectivity and sustainable use of resources.

European integration is the overarching priority of NSDI II and for many years the most important strategic priority. Albania's vision for European integration has full political consensus and popular support. Success of the process, through accession negotiations leading to full membership, depends upon the completion of many complex and interrelated conditions, including five areas identified as priority conditions for opening of accession negotiations, as follows:

- O Public administration reform, stable institutions and a modern, professional and depoliticised civil service:
- O Strengthening of the independence, efficiency and accountability of judicial institutions;
- O Increasing the fight against corruption;
- O Increasing the fight against organised crime;
- O Ensuring the protection of human rights (including property rights).

A set of about 40 sectoral strategies adopted by the Albanian government complement the strategic framework of the Integrated Planning System. NSDI II is organised around EU integration as the overarching goal, with thirteen cross-cutting foundations on good governance, democracy and rule of law, and four main sectoral pillars.

Implementation of NSDI II is monitored through three sets of national monitoring indicators which are: (i) specific to EU integration as agreed between government and the EC, (ii) cover 40 sectors, sub-sectors and major programmes included in NSDI II, and (iii) macroeconomic indicators. The SDGs are integrated into NSDI II, including a specific annex showing the links between the pillars and sub-themes, and the different SDGs.

The accession to the European Union (EU) is the overarching national priority and the most important strategic ambition as the EU integration process has political consensus and nationwide support as a sound way of achieving a sustainable future for the people of Albania. The strategic objective of ensuring good governance and rule of law with the ultimate aim of EU accession is a cross-cutting objective of the NSDI and underpins all other strategic objectives. The European integration process has been driven by the progress and completion of many complex and interrelated reforms, including five areas identified as priorities in this process:

- O **Public Administration Reform (PAR)**: stable institutions and a modern, professional and depoliticised civil service. PAR is closely linked to the EU integration process and is one of the key priorities of the Albanian government. PAR is focused especially on improving the efficiency and transparency of public services delivery, training civil servants, establishing more transparent recruitment procedures and strengthening the administration's capacity to undertake merit-based recruitment. Reform of public administration is closely linked with the envisaged reforms under the Digital Albania Strategy and the Decentralisation Strategy;
- O Strengthening the independence, efficiency and accountability of judicial institutions;
- O Increasing the fight against corruption;
- Increasing the fight against organised crime;
- O Ensuring the protection of human rights, including property rights.

A set of 10 specific indicators – most of which calculated and published by international organisations - cover all the EU integration priorities. All the EU integration indicators use 2012 as a baseline year and NSDI II has specific targets for each indicator, both for the mid-term implementation (2017) and the final target of the NSDI II (2020).

The assessment of the EU integration indicators for the mid-term targets (2017) reveals that:

- O Albania has <u>exceeded NSDI II</u> targets set for 2017 for <u>four</u> EU integration indicators, namely in the areas of:
  - Good governance / public administration reform
  - Statistics
  - Competitiveness
  - Employment
- O Albania has made progress but <u>notreached NSDI II targets</u> set for 2017 for <u>four EU integration</u> indicators, namely in the areas of:
  - Anti-corruption
  - Rule of law
  - Good governance
  - Fundamental rights
- O Albania has not made progress in reaching the target set for 2017 and worsened compared to 2012 for one EU integration indicator, namely in the area of:
  - Transport logistics
- O Data is not available for one EU indicator in the area of local government.

In addition to the EU integration as the key national priority, NSDI II includes its foundations and four main pillars aimed at delivering its vision, as follows:

- O Consolidating good governance, democracy and the rule of law with strong, effective and democratic institutions and a fully functional and open judicial system (foundations)
- O Ensuring growth through macroeconomic and fiscal stability (Pillar I)
- O Ensuring growth through increased competitiveness and innovation (Pillar 2)
- O Investing in people and social cohesion with objectives related to a modern educational system, a universal and quality health care system, expanded employment opportunities, a stronger social protection system, gender equality and social inclusion (Pillar 3)
- O Ensuring growth through connectivity and sustainable use of resources and territorial development (Pillar 4)

Progress achieved in reaching the NSDI II vision in each pillar is measured by two other sets of indicators. The first set includes 15 high-level development and macroeconomic indicators while the second set contains 24 specific indicators for each policy area covered by NSDI II.

### **Key findings**

The assessment of the high-level macroeconomic indicators reveals that:

- O Albania has exceeded NSDI II targets set for 2017 for six high-level macroeconomic indicators
- O Albania has made progress but not reached NSDI II targets set for 2017 for five high-level macroeconomic indicators
- O Albania has not made progress in reaching the target set for 2017 and worsened compared to 2012 for four high-level macroeconomic indicators

The assessment of sector indicators reveals that:

- O Albania has exceeded NSDI II targets set for 2017 for eleven sector indicators
- O Albania has made progress but not reached NSDI II targets set for 2017 for six sector indicators
- O Data is not available for five sector indicators

# 2.4. LINKAGES OF MAPPED STRATEGIES AND PRIORITIES WITH UNITED NATIONS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

The Albanian decision to participate in the pilot work could be seen as an extension of an effort to implement 9th MDG goal (MDG-9) initially designed in 2004, and made more ambitious in 2008, to establish and strengthen good governance. The economy's decision to develop and test governance targets and indicators as part of the UN SDGs framework was aimed at integrating good governance performance measures and indicators into the National Strategy for Development and Integration (NSDI) 2015-2020.

The assessment indicates that 32% of indicators from the global indicators framework is available in Albania, 24% is either available with efforts or partially available, 39% are currently not available and 6% are not applicable to Albania. Most indicators for SDG 3, SDG 1, SDG 5 and SDG 17 are available in Albania while SDG 12, SDG 14, SDG 16, SDG 6 and SDG 11 are the SDGs with the lowest number of indicators from the global framework, with data available for the economy. It is again interesting to show that this assessment clearly illustrates the difference between using the global framework of indicators and the domestic indicators. Two years ago, Albania piloted SDG 16 and a full set of indicators was designed to track its progress. Despite this, the analysis shows that most of SDG 16 indicators from the global framework are currently not collected.<sup>13</sup>

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The Strategic Planning and Development Unit at Prime Minister's Office (PMO), as the central policy coordination body, took the lead of the whole process. After an exhaustive analysis of national sectoral strategies, as well as national, regional and international data sets, a master list of some 120 potential governance targets and indicators was identified. These 120 proposed indicators were then assessed according to their relative fit or support to the government's six strategic priorities and to the main target areas prioritised by the national government. Thereafter, the full list of indicators chosen for tracking was condensed down to a shortlist of 21 cutting across such governance dimensions as accountability, transparency, participation and predictability.

They were grouped based on the NSDI chapters. A validation assessment confirmed the sources of data, data producers (i.e. institution or organisation responsible for producing the data) and systems used to produce data. For those indicators requiring systems which produce data, a quick assessment of time/resources needed to develop/implement supporting measurement/reporting systems was conducted.

Albania and the EU are both committed to the 2030 Agenda on Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals, adopted at the UN Summit in September 2015, which provides a shared framework for progress.<sup>15</sup>

In September 2015, along with 192 other United Nations (UN) member states, Albania committed to the implementation of *Transforming Our World—The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development*. Agenda 2030 in Albania follows the successful implementation of Millennium Development Goals 2000 –2015, especially: (i) poverty reduced; (ii) social inclusion improved; (iii) better education system; (iv) women empowered.

The Inter-Ministerial Committee on SDGs was established in 2017 and is actively leading the Agenda 2030<sup>16</sup>processes in Albania. It is chaired by the Deputy Prime Minister and is comprised of representatives of key government institutions, representatives of local government, civil society, academia, development partners/international agencies and business organisations.

Inter- institutional Working Group on SDG established in 2017 as part of the Prime Minister's Office is operational and coordinates the work at technical level. In Albania, the strategic planning and monitoring processes for the pilot project are the responsibility of the Strategic Planning and Development Unit, which is part of the Department for Development Programming, Financing, and Foreign Aid (DDPFFA) at the Prime Minister's Office (PMO).

A Delivery Unit established at the PMO coordinates and facilitates with line Ministries and central and local agencies the achievement of the six national priorities, which also includes achievement of four indicators from amongst those proposed by the IAEG-SDG for monitoring at the global level.

During 2018,complementary structure was being put in place by the Government of Albania to ensure coordination with broader priorities and objectives associated with the key sectors – the Integrated Policy Management Groups (IPMG), coordinated by the Department for Development, Financing and Foreign Aid at the Prime Minister Office<sup>17</sup>. IPMG members include representatives of line ministries, main donors for the sectors and other stakeholders (civil society, local government representatives, etc.). The IPMGs are to continuously and systematically lead and manage the development, implementation

and monitoring of reforms a cross the specific sectors. The work of IPMGs will be supported through the establishment of sub-thematic groups.

Key government and development stakeholders were also consulted. Several meetings were organised with different line ministries to discuss the importance and the available targets for each of the indicators. In addition, consultative meetings were organised with the participation of CSO, academia, local governments and development partners.

In 2017, the Prime Minister's Office initiated the development of a National Action Plan for Albania's pursuit of SDG. Albania has established links between the SDGs and the EU integration goals, including reference to the Albanian National Plan for European Integration (NPEI) 2014–2020 and the acquis chapters of EU accession negotiations. A consultation process, seeking the cooperation and engagement of all stakeholders, including the local government, academia, civil society organisations and the business community, was organised to discuss and validate the Voluntary National Review (VNR):

Process of Voluntary National Review 2018 included:

- Internal consultations for VNR preparation with more than 15 institutions (line ministries & agencies) involved. Five Inter-ministerial Working Group Meetings organised for discussion and validation of VNR.
- Two SDG Committee Meetings, chaired by Deputy Prime Minister, organised with high-level representatives for launching the process and approval of VNR.
- External consultations with more than 60 invited representatives of civil society, academia, businesses, interest groups, etc.
- O External consultations held with development partners and donors, and UN Agencies (SDG Task Force).



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The linkages between Albania's policy goals and the SDG targets in the national strategies and policy documents show 134 SDG targets (79%) linked to the specific objectives of the national strategic policy framework. This framework is most harmonised with the SDG targets in Goal 3: Good health and wellbeing, Goal 7: Affordable and clean energy, Goal 8: Good jobs and economic growth, and Goal 9: Industry, innovation and infrastructure, while the least harmonisation is with Goal 14: Life below water.

Coherence between the national vision of NSDI II and the SDG framework is reflected in the relation between the SDG targets and the key objectives of the strategy, including the four strategic policy pillars. Through a UN Rapid Integrated Assessment tool, the level of integration of SDGs into NSDI II and the various sectoral strategies was evaluated in 2016. The assessment shows that of 169 SDG targets, 58 are aligned with the national policy, 72 are partially aligned, 19 are unaligned, and 20 are irrelevant to Albania.

Thus, alignment of the SDG targets in the national policy is at some 60 percent. More recently adopted or revised national strategies include a better perspective from the lens of SDGs in the national priorities, a feature that, under the guidance of DDGG, will be especially prominent in the next strategic planning framework, starting in 2020.

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A policy area assessment conducted in 2017 indicates that I40 SDG targets (83%) are directly tied to specific components of the NSDI II pillars, covering the same policy areas in Albania. That same report shows the links between Albania's policy goals and the SDG targets in the national strategies and policy documents, identifying I34SDG targets (79%) linked to the specific objectives of the national strategic policy framework.

Albania Government has conducted a three-pronged process to align indicators in its NSDI 2015-2020 with priorities outlined for accession into the European Union (EU), and some of the targets of Goal 16. Indicators identified as part of the EU integration process were automatically included in the NSDI 2015-2020. Three of these were related to anti-corruption under target 1 of Albania's measurement framework, which aims to ensure the economy moves closer to EU standards by 2030.

The institutional responsibilities for implementation of SDGs are identified and the leading institutions are shown in the table below, also indicating the number of relevant SDG targets per each leading institution.

### **Key findings**

The National Strategy for Development and Integration (NSDI-II) 2015-2020 is the key policy document outlining the development vision for Albania.

- O I40 SDG targets (83%) are directly tied to specific components of the NSDI II 2015 –2020 pillars
- O 134 SDG targets (79%) are also linked to the specific objectives of the national strategic policy framework

To succeed in implementation of Agenda 2030 and achieve national 2030 vision, Albania must engage in the process of establishing a roadmap for the SDG implementation and the new target for 2030 as this would help in identifying roles and responsibilities of the key institutions and other stakeholders in the process.

As a participatory bottom-up process, implementation of Agenda 2030 calls for the mobilisation of government resources and the full engagement of civil society, the business community, academia, local governments and all development partners. Implementation of SDGs calls for improved institutional capacities not only at the level of central government ministries, but also of local governments, academia, civil society organisations and other stakeholders engaged in the process.

### Challenges in achieving SDGs in Albania

Defining the National Vision for 2030, particularly in the policy areas most relevant for Albania, through the contribution and cooperation of all stakeholders involved in the process is essential to ensure progress in the implementation of Agenda 2030.

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Albania would work further to prioritise the SDGs in the national context, based on the identified priorities and the commitments deriving from the European integration process.

To achieve the National Vision 2030 Albania is fully committed to the implementation of Agenda 2030 and a specific roadmap for the process will be prepared and adopted. The Albanian Government would continue to strengthen institutional development at all levels with the goal of successfully achieving the SDGs. Particularly, the improvement of the monitoring mechanisms and processes, and statistical capacities is at the focus of the government. The Albanian Government is fully committed to allocate and utilise the financial means for the achievement of SDGs and is committed to playing an active role, also at the level of Western Balkan region, in advancing the Agenda 2030 at the global level.

### 2.5. CONSULTATIONS WITH KEY PARTNERS

This report is developed in close cooperation and partnership with the Albanian Government. Furthermore, consultations took place with relevant institutions such as the judiciary, local government, civil society, international organisations as well as other donors. The Albanian Government, the relevant institutions, civil society representatives and international and bilateral development partners provided their comments and suggestions to the revision of report.



### **Key findings**

**Working in partnership with multiple stakeholders:** multi-stakeholder partnerships, between civil society and government in particular, have been useful in advancing the work on identifying and refining relevant information. The involvement of, and coordination between, statistics offices, other government agencies and academics have facilitated efforts to develop an integrated list of projects and institutions involved. This experience suggests that partnerships at all levels – through consultation in local communities, across government, and between government actors and stakeholders in oversight bodies, in civil society and the private sector, is very helpful.

# 2.6. REVIEW OF DONOR COORDINATION MECHANISMS

Albania has established a comprehensive system for policy-making and coordination. The Integrated Planning System (IPS) provides the overall architecture to ensure that government policy planning, budgeting and monitoring are linked and operate efficiently. The IPS is composed of three cornerstones – the national and sector strategies providing guidance to high-level policy making; the European integration process describing the planning and resource requirements to achieve the objectives under the EU integration agenda; and the medium-term budget process detailing the short and medium-term planning and financial arrangements for the delivery of policies by each ministry and government agency.



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
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Albanian government includes a Strategic Planning Committee as an inter-ministerial committee chaired by the Prime Minister that reviews and endorses the government's policy and fiscal priorities. This involves: (i) setting the policy priorities and strategic directions within a sound fiscal framework at the beginning of the annual planning process; (ii) deciding on the inter-sector resource allocation (MTBP preparation ceilings) over the medium term, i.e. 3 years; (iii) reviewing the draft MTBP prior to the preparation of the state budget; and (iv) receiving regular reports on progress against key IPS commitments.

The mechanism for dialogue on priorities, planning, coordination and monitoring of the implementation of relevant strategies and action plans is established under the Integrated Policy Management Group (IPMG) Good Governance and Public Administration with dedicated thematic sub-groups.

In 2015 a new Integrated Policy Management Group (IPMG) mechanism was launched in five pilot sectors (competitiveness and innovation, employment and social policies, public administration reform and good governance, public financial management, and integrated water management) and was coordinated by the Prime Minister's Office.

The IMPG is intended to ensure joint cooperation and decision-making at a high political and managerial level and to provide leadership in the follow-up of the coordinated implementation through discussion of periodic progress and monitoring reports; to support regular dialogue and interaction with development and integration partners.



Albania's development and EU integration efforts are supported by over 40 bilateral and multilateral donors. Sector level donor coordination structures functioned in 2017c however, the set-up is being reorganised. In September 2017, the responsibility for donor coordination was transferred to the Ministry of Finance and Economy, which takes a proactive role in organising this function and aims at increasing the comprehensiveness of resource allocations concerning the national budget and donors.

The EU Delegation Chairs the Donor Technical Secretariat which encompasses the key donors and development partners of Albania (Austrian Development Agency, Italian Agency for Development Cooperation, Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany, Embassy of Sweden, Embassy of Switzerland, European Union, Council of Europe, EBRD, OSCE, USAID, UN, World Bank) and facilitates the government donor exchange.

A high-level donor-government dialogue is taking place once a year as 'round table' to focus on aid harmonisation, followed by regular operational meetings. In addition to the coordination by the government of Albania, the EU is regularly consulting with other donors, civil society and others (e.g. judiciary), both at the time of preparing the overall strategic approach, as well as for the preparation of annual programmes. IPA assistance to Albania is coordinated and complementary with the European Initiative for Democracy and Human Rights (EIDHR).

The implementation of strategic plans is planned through the medium-term budget programmes which take into account projections for domestic and donor funded resources to implement the strategies. The donor funds are be recorded in the external assistance management information system as part of the integrated planning system for strategic planning and related budget programmes.

Following the reorganisation of the central government in September 2017 the sector strategy monitoring and coordination structures are being reorganised to be streamlined with the mandate of the line ministries and other strategic processes related to policy implementation and effective coordination. Some other aspects to be strengthened are: (i) the streamlining and harmonisation of sector strategy monitoring and coordination responsibilities, (ii) the detailing of the business processes to be applied by the entities and staff involved in operating the mechanism, (iii) the human resources requirements, (iv) systematic support to effective inter-institutional coordination and active engagement of civil society and donor and development partners.<sup>18</sup>

### **Key findings**

Albania's development is supported by over 40 bilateral and multilateral donors. The key donors and development partners of Albania are Austrian Development Agency, Italian Agency for Development Cooperation, Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany, Embassy of Sweden, Embassy of Switzerland, European Union, Council of Europe, EBRD, OSCE, USAID, UN, and World Bank.

The overall goal of the **Swiss cooperation strategy in Albania 2018-2021** is to contribute to a functioning democracy, improved public services and an inclusive, competitive market economy in support of Albania's European integration. Development work in Albania focuses on four domains: (i) Democratic Governance, (ii) Economic Development and Employment, (iii) Urban Infrastructure and Energy, and (iv) Health.

**USAID** – "Albania 2011-2018 Country Development Cooperation Strategy" proposes an overarching goal of European integration through strengthened democratic institutions and inclusive economic growth. Two Development Objectives (DOs) support this goal.

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DO#I, strengthened rule of law and improved governance: Under this DO, there is a strong focus on strengthening the relationship between the central and local governments in order to improve planning, create the framework for development of a national territorial plan, and assure more efficient and transparent delivery of key public services that touch the daily lives of all citizens, e.g. water, sewerage, energy, and education.

DO#2, conditions created for broadbased, sustainable, and inclusive economic growth: This DO focuses on putting in place those reforms and regulations that will lead to a better business environment, more competitive micro, small and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs), and a stronger financial sector.

**Sida's Development Cooperation** with Albania aims to bring the economy closer to the EU membership. The support has three priority areas: improving economic integration, strengthening democracy, and improving the environment and reducing climate impact.

The strategy for 2014-2020 focuses on three results areas: I) Enhanced economic integration with the EU and development of market economy. This includes efforts to strengthen economic development and increase employment by improving the conditions for small and medium-sized enterprises and by facilitating trade between economies. 2) Strengthened democracy, greater respect for human rights and

more fully developed state under the rule of law. Efforts are needed to strengthen public administration and the judiciary. Support is also designed to strengthen human rights, civil society, media and gender equality. 3) A better environment and reduced climate impact and enhanced resilience to environmental impact and climate change. The third results area is focused on sustainable community services related to water and sanitation, waste management, energy efficiency and renewable energy.

"Country Partnership Framework (CPF)" sets out the **World Bank Group** (**WBG**) **programme for Albania for the period FY15-19,** aimed at supporting Albania's aspiration to achieve equitable growth and integration into the European Union. The CPF selectively chooses only five of the twelve SCD priorities and builds a programme of support around this subset of priorities on the basis of additional selectivity filters. These five fundamental priorities include: I) restoring fiscal sustainability and maintaining financial stability; 2) establishing a high-quality business environment; 3) providing clean, efficient, equitable and financially sustainable energy; 4) formalising and enhancing inclusiveness and sustainability of land markets; and 5) enhancing governance, transparency and accountability of government.

The current World Bank Group (WBG) programme in Albania is guided by the "Country Partnership Framework (CPF)" for FYI5–I9 which provides analysis, advice, and financing in support of equitable growth in Albania and integration into the EU. The CPF, which now enters its final year of implementation, focuses on three main areas:

- restoring macroeconomic balances
- O creating conditions for accelerated private sector growth
- O strengthening public sector management and service delivery

Around 80 percent of the programme has been delivered, supporting some of the Government's main priorities, including macroeconomic and fiscal sustainability and competitiveness, as well as governance and accountability in the public services, energy, and water sectors.

**UNDP- "Country Programme Document for Albania (2017-2021)**" outlines four programme pillars: Democratic Governance and Rule of Law; Promoting Social Inclusion and the rights of vulnerable communities; ensuring that young women and men have opportunities and skills; Environment and Climate Change.

Programme priorities are drawn from the United Nations Programme of Cooperation for Sustainable Development 2017–2021, which in turn supports selected objectives of the NSDI for 2015-2020. Programme priorities reflect the comparative advantages of UNDP in supporting national reforms, upholding values of rights and equity and promoting gender equality and women's empowerment.

The GoA–UN Programme of Cooperation for Sustainable Development for the period 2017–2021<sup>20</sup> provides a framework for attaining results that focuses on upstream support and is strategic, forward-looking and fully aligned to Albania's strategic priorities.

The framework builds on the successes of the previous Programme and continues the Delivering-as-One approach. It describes how the government and the UN, drawing on the full range of expertise and resources of the UN system agencies, will work in partnership to achieve development results.

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# 3. Conclusions and recommendations

Currently, Albania has not yet set long-term public policy priorities for 2030. The establishment of institutional working groups for drafting the strategic document for post-2020 period is currently under way. It is therefore very important to initiate a bottom-up process of **establishing a national vision for the year 2030**, particularly in the policy areas most relevant for Albania.

This process should be based on the contribution and cooperation of all stakeholders involved in the process and must ensure a broad political consensus. The completion of the national strategic framework by the year 2020 provides a good opportunity to combine Vision 2030 with the next strategic planning framework, due to start in the period 2019–2020.

Albania's positive experience with NSDI II and SDGs as reflected in different reports reveals that the key to success in the implementation process is the engagement of all stakeholders at national and local levels, comprising a broad and diverse spectrum of institutions and organisations from central government, local government, business organisations, civil society, academia, development partners, EU, UN agencies and other domestic and donor organisations active in Albania.

Key challenges in this process include:

- O More focus-oriented strategies, reduced in numbers
- O Efforts to establish a national vision for the year 2030
- O Utilisation of SDG indicators (available in Albania)
- O Identification of policy gaps and acceleration of action in priority areas
- O Prioritisation of SDGs in local context,
- O A stronger outcome monitoring framework

### Future needs for sector support

**Component I:** Sector-wide approach programme through good governance principles, including coordination of EU accession process

### Strength the performance: Outlook on Good Governance (horizontal issues).

- O Developing Good Governance Programme based on sector-wide approach (planning and monitoring tools).
- Dedicated support to Technical Secretariat for Good Governance and Public Administration to enforce the analytical tool on the performance-based diagnosis for the **Good Governance Programme**.
- O Policy management system & policy harmonisation with the EU & Strategic Planning System IPS III. Currently, the IPS system is in the phase of automating its main pillars, **consisting in the**

establishment and operation of three MIS systems, which will function as a onestop-shop for public policy & finance management, by the state administration. The three systems are designed as a Single Multi-Beneficiary Integrated System creating the conditions to link planning-budgeting-execution and have information and real-time monitoring of performance.

- O Increase of technical capacities at the central level (support for system capacity-building users in the area of system management and processes related to IPS System).
- O **Support to developing a Public Consultation Roadmap** in order to improve transparency of policy development in the central of governance.
- O **Support to the IPMG/ Sector Steering Committee.** Further assistance is required to ensure continuity and smooth operation of IPMGs/SSC structures, technical secretariats and thematic groups in existing sectors and enhance capacities, effectiveness and performance of existing IPMGs.

**Component II:** The performance approach is improved at sectoral level

### Consolidate Centre of Government Functions – Strengthening of Policy Making
