Tackling Informal Employment in Serbia: Current Situation and the Way Forward  
National Workshop

**Introduction**

The existence of informal economy and informal employment has been identified by the European Commission and other international and local agencies (OECD, ILO etc.) as a major barrier to enabling economic prosperity in Serbia. ESAP-RCC has recently produced a diagnostic report for Serbia that looks at drivers of undeclared work, the institutional framework and current policy approaches. Building on current efforts to reduce the informal economy and particularly the informal employment, fundamental efforts should be paid to building a holistic strategic approach to tackling informality. In this regard, the diagnosis report is complemented by a list of key recommendations on tackling undeclared work prepared by the ESAP-RCC experts.

**Objectives**

The workshop will provide policy-makers, employer and employees' organizations, economic experts, researchers and other actors with an opportunity to learn more about the results of an expert analysis of the informal economy and employment in Serbia and recommendations for tackling informality from a holistic perspective. It will also encourage an open discussion among relevant actors in Serbia on issues related to informal employment such as: What is the nature of informal employment in Serbia? What are the barriers to formalization? What are the measures the Serbian government has undertaken to tackle informal employment and what are the results so far? What are the next steps the Serbian government, in collaboration with other key stakeholders, should undertake to tackle the informal employment into a more coordinated and holistic approach?

Inspired by the work of the European Platform Tackling Undeclared Work, this workshop is the first step towards the goal of supporting Western Balkan economies in effectively tackling undeclared work through a holistic approach, while at the same time establishing a strong base for exchange of good practices and mutual learning among peer institutions in the region.
