Historical background

1957: Treaty of Rome establishing the EEC

1962: « General program » aiming for the suppression of restrictions

in the freedom of establisment;

1962-1982: « Transitional directives » on the recognition of qualifications in

the craftsmen and industry sectors;

1975 : First directive on the recognition of qualifications of doctors;

1977-1985: Five other professions with automatic recognition (nurses,

midwives, pharmacist, veterinary surgeons and dentists);

1986: «Eurodocs»

1989 et 1992: Two general directives on the recognition of professional

qualifications;

2005 : Directive 2005/36/EC (consolidation);

2013: Revision of Directive 2005/36/CE (EPC, alert mechanism).

U Establishment and provision of services

Two ways of working abroad:

Keep the main place of business in the establishment MS (for ex. Montenegro)

Have an effective economic activity there

Work in another country (f. ex. Albania) for a specific work/task/manate (do and go)

Provision of services

Liberalisation, even of regulated professions (few exceptions)

Title II PQD

Leave your origin State

Close your business / quit your job, etc.

Move in another country, with the intention to remain there and make your business there

Establishment

Recognition of regulated professions

Title III PQD

How does it work in case of a provision of services?

- Liberalisation => if you want to control anything, you have to ask for a declaration; no legal basis => total freedom, even if the profession in regulated.
- A prior declaration is possible for any regulated profession, but a control of the qualifications is possible only for professions with impact on public health or public security.
- Very strict deadlines, no reaction from the authority within the delay = right to provide the services.

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Automatic/general system

Automatic system

General system

Coordination of the education

Mandatory rules regarding the education

No coordination, principle of origin

Acquried rights system (annex VI)

Automatic recognition, no compensation measures are possible

Comparison of the the content of the education, compensation measures by substantial differencies

You have to accept **any diploma listed** in the annex V and VI

You have to consider any qualification allowing the professional, in his/her MS, to pursue the profession.

Sectoral system for Architects

- Basically, for sectoral professions, the minimum training requirement are mandatory.
- Exception for architects: a MS can educate his/her architects without to respect the minimum training requirements.
- In that case there is no automatic recognition, but the general system applies.

Qualifications and other requirements (annex VII PQD).

Do not forget that the PQD is not only about qualifications. Annex VII is applicable to other requirements:

- Proof of professional experience;
- Proof of good character/good standing;
- Proof that the professional has not been declared bankrupt, or suspended or prohibited to pursue the profession;
- Document relating to the physical or mental health
- Proof of the applicant's financial standing
- proof that the applicant is insured against the financial risks.
