#### Introduction

The Albanian government has designed and implemented the "National Action Plan for Roma inclusion 2010-2015", after the participation in the initiative of many countries of Europe, the "Decade of Roma Inclusion 2005-2015". In line with some other policy documents as well as recommendations from the Seminar organized in cooperation with the European Commission Delegation in 2014, was drafted and approved by DCM no. 1072, dated 23.12.2015 "The National Action Plan for the Integration of Roma and Egyptians", which is a new engagement of the Albanian Government with a timeline of 2016-2020 targeting the two communities concerned.

After completing the training with all focal points for updating the electronic system ROMALB with data on the indicators of the "National Action Plan for the Integration of Roma and Egyptians in the Republic of Albania, 2016-2020" and in cooperation with RCC Roma Integration 2020, Ministry of Social Welfare and Youth presents the first report on the implementation of the Action Plan for the year 2016.

This monitoring report contains data and information on the area of Education and Intercultural Dialogue, Equal Access to Civil Registration and Justice, Social Protection, Employment and Vocational Education and Training, Urban Housing, Health Care, and Coordination and Monitoring Policies.

The data sources used to evaluate the progress made in 2016, are the data submitted to the Romalb system as well as the administrative data coming from line ministries and municipalities. Also, data from donors were used according to the projects they are implementing.

Considering that 45% of the total cost of implementing the Action Plan is foreseen to be covered by donors, there are many measures, especially those related to conducting various analyzes or studies, that are foreseen to be funded by donors. The cases, when these budgets are not realized, indicate that donors have not been found to support them or in some cases funding has begun in 2017.

In this first reporting for 2016, it is impossible to calculate all the impact assessment indicators, due to the lack of general data regarding Roma and Egyptian Population as well as disaggregated data for this two communities. The only official data for Roma and Egyptians correspond to y.2011 Census of Population and shows only the total number of Roma and Egyptian Communities in Albania. The report present some impact assessment indicators referring to the data released by the Roma Census 2014 conducted by Sorros Foundation.

The 2016 report will serve as a baseline for the generations of reports for the coming years on the implementation and monitoring of the National Action Plan for the Integration of Roma and Egyptians.
